CATALOG DESCRIPTION: This is an online version of courses meeting core requirements as listed in the VSU student catalogue as described below:

BIOL 1030. Introduction to Biology: Organismal Biology. 3 Hours.

Corequisite: BIOL 1040L This course cannot be taken for credit toward the major in biology. An introduction to modern biology for the normal major with special emphasis on the processes involved in the development and maintenance of complex multicellular organisms.

This course focusses on the chemical and cellular level of organization with genetics of living things.
